how skirting the law once defined america s relation to the world in the frigid winter of 1875 charles I lawrence made international headlines when he was arrested for smuggling silk worth 60 million into the united states an intimate of boss tweed gloriously dubbed the prince of smugglers and the head of a network spanning four continents and lasting half a decade lawrence scandalized a nation whose founders themselves had once dabbled in contraband since the revolution itself smuggling had tested the patriotism of the american people distrusting foreign goods congress instituted high tariffs on most imports protecting the nation was the custom house which waged a war on smuggling inspecting every traveler for illicitly imported silk opium tobacco sugar diamonds and art the civil war s blockade of the confederacy heightened the obsession with contraband but smuggling entered its prime during the gilded age when characters like assassin louis bieral economist the parsee merchant congressman ben butler and actress rose eytinge tempted consumers with illicit foreign luxuries only as the united states became a global power with world war i did smuggling lose its scurvy romance meticulously researched contraband explores the history of smuggling to illuminate the broader history of the united states its power its politics and its culture

the memories within the millions of people who experienced crystal beach even just once will never be lost one of canada's greatest entertainment centres existed for one hundred years in an isolated little village in one of the southernmost corners of ontario just across the lake from buffalo new york nicknamed buffalo's coney island the crystal beach amusement park swarmed with american visitors in its mid century glory days and its stories were carried all over the world a crystal beach resident since childhood gary pooler takes readers behind the scenes of a world class amusement park combining local history sports journalism true crime and north american folklore to create a unique picture of the quirky crystal beach community both in and out of the park through its geographical and social history these collected stories tell of the life and times in an amusement park resort community a summer long carnival illegal prizefighting in the nearby sand hills world class entertainers and athletes featuring the likes of jesse owens an eccentric traveling minstrel vaudevillians settling in the village police scandals bootlegging and even murder pooler chronicles the gradual decline and closure of the amusement park and the effect this had on the village and illustrates the community's triumphant renaissance in recent years harrowing and nostalgic crystal beach out of the park is a rare and vital historical record and a spirited exploration of crystal beach in all of its various shades and stages

this book recounts the personal and professional life of thomas souness hamblin 1800 1853 shakespearean actor and bowery theatre manager primarily responsible for the popularity of blood and thunder melodramas with working class audiences in new york city hamblin discovered trained and promoted many young actors and especially actresses who later became famous in their own right he also epitomized the sporting man of mid nineteenth century life conducting a scandalous series of affairs and visits to manhattan brothels which cost him his marriage to elizabeth blanchard hamblin 1799 1849 and made him the brunt of moralist religious and journalistic crusades notably that of james gordon bennett s new york herald his machinations and perseverance through trying challenges including several destructions of the bowery theatre by fire extensive financial and legal complications and the untimely deaths of several young protégées earned him equal measures of admiration and opprobrium

how american bicyclists shaped the landscape and left traces of their journeys for us in writing illustrations and photographs in the later part of the nineteenth century american bicyclists were explorers cycling through both charted and uncharted territory these wheelmen and wheelwomen became keen observers of suburban and rural landscapes and left copious records of their journeys in travel narratives journalism maps photographs illustrations they were also instrumental in the construction of roads and paths wheelways building them funding them and lobbying legislators for them their explorations shaped the landscape and the way we look at it yet with few exceptions their writings have been largely overlooked by landscape scholars and many of the paths cyclists cleared have disappeared in old wheelways robert mccullough restores the pioneering cyclists of the nineteenth century to the history of american landscapes mccullough recounts marathon cycling trips around the northeast undertaken by hardy cyclists who then describe their journeys in such magazines as the wheelman illustrated and bicycling world the work of illustrators including childe hassam before his fame as a painter efforts by cyclists to build better rural roads and bicycle paths and conflicts with park planners including the famous olmsted firm who often opposed separate paths for bicycles today s ubiquitous bicycle lanes owe their origins to nineteenth century versions including new york city s asphalt ribbons long before there were rails to trails there was a movement to adapt existing passageways including aqueduct corridors trolley rights of way and canal towpaths for bicycling the campaigns for wheelways mccullough points out offer a prologue to nearly every obstacle faced by those advocating bicycle paths and lanes today mccullough s text is enriched by more than one hundred historic images of cyclists often attired in skirts and bonnets suits and ties country lanes and city streets

mass media in the late nineteenth century was full of news from mars in the wake of giovanni schiaparelli s 1877 discovery of enigmatic dark straight lines on the red planet astronomers and the public at large vigorously debated the possibility that it might be inhabited as rivalling scientific practitioners looked to marshal allies and sway public opinion through newspapers periodicals popular books exhibitions and encyclopaedias they exposed disagreements over how the discipline of astronomy should be organized and how it should establish acceptable conventions of discourse news from mars provides a new account

of this extraordinary episode in the history of astronomy revealing how major transformations in astronomical practice across britain and america were inextricably tied up with popular scientific culture and a transatlantic news economy that enabled knowledge to travel as joshua nall argues astronomers were journalists too eliding practice with communication in consequential ways as writers and editors they played a pivotal role in the emergence of a new astronomy dedicated to the study of the physical constitution and life history of celestial objects blurring harsh distinctions between those who produced esoteric knowledge and those who disseminated it

just as the new technology of photography was emerging throughout the united states in the mid nineteenth century it caught hold in the scenic adirondack region of upstate new york young men and a few women began to experiment with cameras as a way to earn their livings with local portrait work from photographing individuals some expanded their subject matter to include families and groups homes streetscapes landmarks workplaces and important events from town celebrations to presidential visits train wrecks floods and fires these photographers from within and just beyond the park s borders as well as those based in the urban areas from which tourists came to the adirondacks have been central in defining the region adirondack photographers 1850 1950 is a comprehensive look at the first one hundred years of photography through the lives of those who captured this unique rural region of new york state svenson s fascinating biographical dictionary of more than two hundred photographers is enriched with over seventy illustrations while the popularity of some of these photographers is reflected in the number of their images held in the collections of the library of congress the new york public library and the getty museum little is known about the diverse backgrounds of the individuals behind their work a compilation of captivating stories adirondack photographers provides a vivid intimate account of the evolution of photography as well as an unusual perspective on adirondack history

from the end of the nineteenth century until the onset of the great depression wall street embarked on a stunning unprecedented and often bloody period of international expansion in the caribbean a host of financial entities sought to control banking trade and finance in the region in the process they not only trampled local sovereignty grappled with domestic banking regulation and backed us imperialism but they also set the model for bad behavior by banks visible still today in bankers and empire peter james hudson tells the provocative story of this period taking a close look at both the institutions and individuals who defined this era of american capitalism in the west indies whether in wall street minstrel shows or in dubious practices across the caribbean the behavior of the banks was deeply conditioned by bankers racial views and prejudices drawing deeply on a broad range of sources hudson reveals that the banks experimental practices and projects in the caribbean often led to embarrassing failure and eventually literal erasure from the archives

lucy pier stevens a twenty one year old woman from ohio began a visit to her aunt s family near bellville texas on christmas day 1859 little did she know how drastically her life would change on april 4 1861 when the outbreak of the civil war made returning home impossible stranded in enemy territory for the duration of the war how would she reconcile her northern

upbringing with the southern sentiments surrounding her lucy stevens s diary one of few women s diaries from civil war era texas and the only one written by a northerner offers a unique perspective on daily life at the fringes of america s bloodiest conflict an articulate educated and keen observer stevens took note of seemingly everything the weather illnesses food shortages parties church attendance chores schools childbirth death the family s slaves and political and military news as she confided her private thoughts to her journal she unwittingly revealed how her love for her texas family and the confederate soldier boys she came to care for blurred her loyalties even as she continued to long for her home in ohio showing how the ties of heritage kinship friendship and community transcended the sharpest division in us history this rare diary and vicki adams tongate s insightful historical commentary on it provide a trove of information on women s history texas history and civil war history

this book is a must read for all those interested in the evolution of airplanes its protagonist octave chanute is best known for his scientific and collaborative approach to the engineering problems related to the development of flight and for the support he gave to the many aeronautical pioneers including the wright brothers but as the author clearly demonstrates this engineer s contributions in the aeronautical field have frequently been underestimated even though almost every famous and not so famous aeronautical enthusiast contacted him and used the readily available drawings of his glider to build and then learn to fly in their own design chanute s biplane glider design developed and flown first in 1896 in the indiana dunes along lake michigan proved to be a key step in the evolution of the flying machine by freely sharing not only drawings of the general design of this aircraft but also the lessons learned the biplane became the starting point or prototype for many experimenters and can be considered the foundation for the modern airplane this book focuses on chanute s work in aeronautics not having the internet of today he became the post box of early aeronautics not only because of his landmark book progress in flying machines but also because of his strong connections to anyone and everyone who worked in the aeronautical field he made a point of continuing to learn throughout his own life and strongly believed in sharing knowledge while fostering and mentoring all those who were willing to learn

see how conensus lake has grown to become a finger lakes tourist hotspot conesus lake is the westernmost of the 11 finger lakes often referred to as one of the little fingers it is located about 25 miles south of rochester new york in 1924 the city of rochester announced plans to use conesus lake to supplement the water supply for its residents a year later cottagers around the lake successfully banded together to protect conesus s sparkling waters and preserve the area as a summer resort over time the lake area has grown and restaurants taverns campgrounds and amusement parks have sprung up from the demand of the lake s many visitors today four towns geneseo groveland conesus and livonia border the approximate 18 miles of shoreline

the forgotten actresses series combines real life research with hollywood babylon flavor to create a sympathetic look at some famous hollywood hard luck cases book one the forgotten flapper a presence lurks in new york city's new amsterdam theatre when the lights go down and the audience goes home they say she s the ghost of olive thomas one of the loveliest girls who ever lit up the ziegfeld follies and the silent screen from her longtime home at the theater ollie's ghost tells her story from her early life in pittsburgh to her tragic death at twenty five after winning a contest for the most beautiful girl in new york shopgirl ollie modeled for the most famous artists in new york and then went on to become the toast of broadway when hollywood beckoned ollie signed first with triangle pictures and then with myron selznick s new production company becoming most well known for her work as a baby vamp the precursor to the flappers of the 1920s after a stormy courtship she married playboy jack pickford mary pickford's wastrel brother together they developed a reputation for drinking club going wrecking cars and fighting along with giving each other expensive make up gifts ollies mysterious death in paris ritz hotel in 1920 was one of hollywood's first scandals ensuring that her legend lived on book two the it girl and me daisy devoe has left her abusive husband her father has been pinched for bootlegging and she's embarrassed by her rural kentucky roots but on the plus side she s climbing the ladder in the salon of paramount pictures styling hair for actress clara bow clara is a handful the it girl of the jazz age personifies the new woman of the 1920s onscreen smoking drinking bootleg hooch and bursting with sex appeal but her conduct off the set is even more scandalous hoping to impose a little order on clara's chaotic life paramount persuades daisy to sign on as clara s personal secretary thanks to daisy clara s bank account is soon flush with cash and thanks to clara daisy can finally shake off her embarrassing past and achieve respectability for herself and her family the trouble begins when clara s newest fiancé cowboy star rex bell wants to take over and he and daisy battle for control torn between her loyalty to clara and her love for her family daisy has to make a difficult choice when she ends up in the county iail here daisy sets the record straight from her poverty stricken childhood to her failed marriage from a father in san quentin

to her rollercoaster time with clara leaving out none of the juicy details book three bathing beauty during hollywood s infancy marie prevost is a beautiful canadian who becomes famous for her silent film work with mack sennett s bathing beauties lured away by an offer from universal pictures she makes more profitable flapper themed movies and when her contract ends she moves to warner brothers where her star continues to rise her triumph in ernst lubitsch s the marriage circle and her marriage to actor kenneth harlan mark her as one of filmdom s biggest stars of the 1920s but in 1926 a series of tragedies combine to torpedo her career by the 1930s with her star fallen marie desperately claws her way back fighting weight gain and alcohol in her struggle to get back on top in bathing beauty marie tells the story of her rise to fame and her struggle to regain it despite all the odds

unbridled passions threatened nineteenth century america a vulnerable young nation already feeling beset by foreigners corruption and disease purifying crusaders like hamilton college philosophy professor and presbyterian minister john w mears mobilized to fight every sin and carnal lure from liquor to free love in upstate new york s famed oneida community mears encountered his stiffest challenge oneida s founder and patriarch john humphrey noyes oversaw a radical christian commune where men and women sexually mingled through the practice of complex marriage while others struggled to dislodge the community that had evolved since 1848 into a successful business venture and congenial neighbor it was mears who after years of trying rallied new york s church and university leaders for a final concerted anti oneida campaign in the ministers war doyle traces the full story of mears and the crusade against the oneida community he explores the ways in which mears s multipurpose zeal reflected the passions behind the nineteenth century temperance movement the fight against obscenity and the public animus toward unconventional thought as an author political candidate and controversialist mears was a prominent moralizer at a time when public morality seemed to be most at risk

a compelling story about three murders in brooklyn between 1872 and 1873 and the young women charged with the crimes between january 1872 and september 1873 the city of brooklyn was gripped by accounts of three murders allegedly committed by young women a factory girl shot her employer and seducer an evidently peculiar woman shot a philandering member of a prominent brooklyn family and a former nun was arrested on suspicion of having hanged her best friend and onetime convent mate two were detained at the county jail on raymond street while one remained at large and her pursuit and eventual arrest was complicated by dissension in the police department lawyers for all three women prepared insanity defenses and citizens thronged the courtrooms to witness the suspenseful trials an intriguing account of the events surrounding the cases which became entwined with brooklyn s politics and religious differences the three graces of raymond street offers insights into the sexual mores of the times and illustrates the development of the modern american city robert e murphy has done a wonderful job recreating the lost city of brooklyn in the years following the civil war through the stories of three women jailed for murder he brings to life the personalities and places and scandals that made brooklyn a vibrant vital place this is a terrific read terry golway author of machine made tammany hall and the creation of modern american politics

longlisted for the 2024 baillie gifford prize for non fiction a new york times most anticipated book fabulous one gets a thrilling sense of history unfolding in real time matthew reisz the guardian this dazzling innovative family memoir tells the story of a long lost plan to create a jewish state in texas on june 7 1907 a ship packed with russian jews sets sail not to jerusalem or new york as many on board have dreamed but to texas the man who persuades the passengers to go is david jochelmann rachel cockerell s great grandfather the journey marks the beginning of the galveston movement a forgotten moment in history when ten thousand jews fled to texas in the leadup to world war i the charismatic leader of the movement is jochelmann s closest friend israel zangwill whose novels have made him famous across europe and america as eastern europe becomes infected by antisemitic violence zangwill embarks on a desperate search for a temporary homeland from australia to canada angola to antarctica before reluctantly settling on galveston he fears the jewish people will be absorbed into the great american melting pot but there is no other hope in a highly inventive style cockerell captures history as it unfolds weaving together letters diaries memoirs newspaper articles and interviews into a vivid account melting point follows zangwill and the jochelmann family through two world wars to london new york and jerusalem as their lives intertwine with some of the most memorable figures of the twentieth century and each chooses whether to cling to their history or melt into their new surroundings it is a story that asks what it means to belong and what can be salvaged from the past

mark twain american humorist examines the ways that mark twain s reputation developed at home and abroad in the period between 1865 and 1882 years in which he went from a regional humorist to national and international fame in the late 1860s mark twain became the exemplar of a school of humor that was thought to be uniquely american as he moved into more respectable venues in the 1870s especially through the promotion of william dean howells in the atlantic monthly mark twain muddied the hierarchical distinctions between class appropriate leisure and burgeoning forms of mass entertainment between uplifting humor and debased laughter and between the literature of high culture and the passing whim of the merely popular

rounding out the picture of pre prohibition tippling this colorful and good humored volume is a must read for anyone who appreciates the timeless appeal of a well made drink and the uniquely american history behind it
